



Johan Ålander leaves his post as President and CEO of ElektronikGruppen

After over three years as President and CEO Johan Ålander has informed the Board that he wishes to leave his post. The company's vice President Jens Hansson has been appointed acting President and CEO. Work to find a permanent President and CEO will be started immediately.

"During his time in the company Johan has developed the business very successfully and has made a strong contribution to a new group structure with clear focus on a number of niches with considerable potential. As Johan has informed the Board that he wants to leave the company, we have together decided that it is best to make this process as short as possible. In Jens we have a strong force who knows the company well and can take over immediately. In this way we will not slow down the business during the recruitment process", says Kenneth Lindqvist, Chairman of the board in ElektronikGruppen.

The annual general meeting of ElektronikGruppen BK AB will be held on 8 May at 5 p.m. in the company's office at Grimstagatan 160 in Vällingby. The interim report for the first quarter 2008 will be published on the same day.
