## New CEO of Carlsberg UK

Isaac Sheps, 59, CEO of Carlsberg South East Europe, has been appointed CEO of Carlsberg UK with effect from 20 October 2008. He replaces Doug Clydesdale who will leave the Carlsberg Group after eleven years at Carlsberg UK, three of which as CEO.

Carlsberg UK has clearly demonstrated good improvements over the past years, and now is an appropriate time for change in leadership to further maximise earnings in a very challenging market.

Since March 2007 Isaac Sheps has headed a very successful development of Carlsberg South East Europe, the umbrella organisation of Carlsberg's activities in Bulgaria, Croatia, Hungaru, Slovenia, Serbia, Bosnia & Herzegovina and Montenegro. Together with his new position in the UK Isaac Sheps will keep his job at Carlsberg South East Europe until the end of this year.
