Truck deliveries May 2008

Total deliveries of trucks from the Volvo Group's four truck companies in May amounted to 22,198, which is an increase of 15%, compared with the year-earlier period.

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Mack

Deliveries in May totaled 1,501 vehicles, up 11% compared with the year-earlier period. The results in May 2007 were impacted by the transition to production of US'07 vehicles, while May 2008 figures reflect temporarily higher build rates at the New River Valley Plant to recoup production lost as a result of the strike earlier this year. Demand for heavy-duty trucks in North America on the whole remains weak, reflecting ongoing sluggishness in the U.S. economy, high fuel prices and softness in housing construction.

Renault Trucks

Deliveries in May totaled 7,046 trucks, up 11% compared with the previous year. Deliveries increased in France while they decreased in Spain and Portugal. All together Europe was up 8% in May and deliveries outside Europe were up 33% compared with the previous year.

Volvo Trucks

Volvo Trucks' deliveries during May amounted to 9,133 vehicles, up 9% compared with the year-earlier period. The volume growth compared to last year is an effect of increased production in Europe and South America. The deliveries of new trucks were at high levels for the main part of Europe. The demand on the North American market remains at a low level. The results in May 2007 were impacted by the transition to production of US'07 vehicles, while May 2008 figures reflect temporarily higher build rates at the New River Valley Plant to recoup production lost as a result of the strike earlier this year. In the Middle East deliveries increased with 55% and in South America with 23%.

Nissan Diesel

Deliveries from Nissan Diesel totaled 4,448 trucks in May, up 39% from the corresponding period a year ago. In Asia, numbers of deliveries were 3,357 units, an increase by 60%. A high rate of deliveries in Asia was especially noted in South East Asia, driven by customers involved in the mining industry. In Japan, numbers of deliveries were 1,853 units, up 49%
