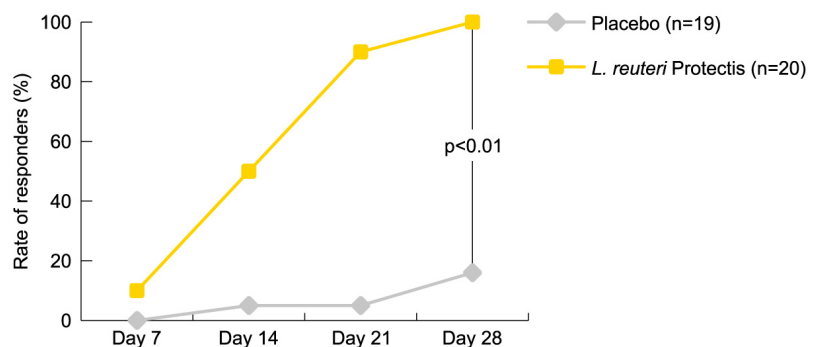


## Positive results in first Chinese study with BioGaia's drops in infants with colic

**A Chinese study of infants with colic shows that babies given *Lactobacillus reuteri* Protectis cry significantly less compared to babies given placebo. The newly published study is the fifth positive colic study with *Lactobacillus reuteri* Protectis and the results confirm the positive results of earlier studies.**

### 100 per cent treatment success

Treatment success was observed in all infants supplemented by *Lactobacillus reuteri* Protectis while it was seen in barely 16 per cent of the placebo group. In addition, the study showed 100 per cent parent satisfaction in the *Lactobacillus reuteri* Protectis group, while barely 16 percent among parents of children in the placebo group reported treatment satisfaction. 42 infants were included in the study.
